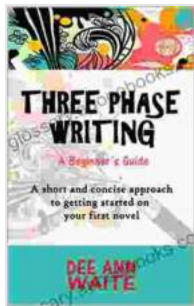

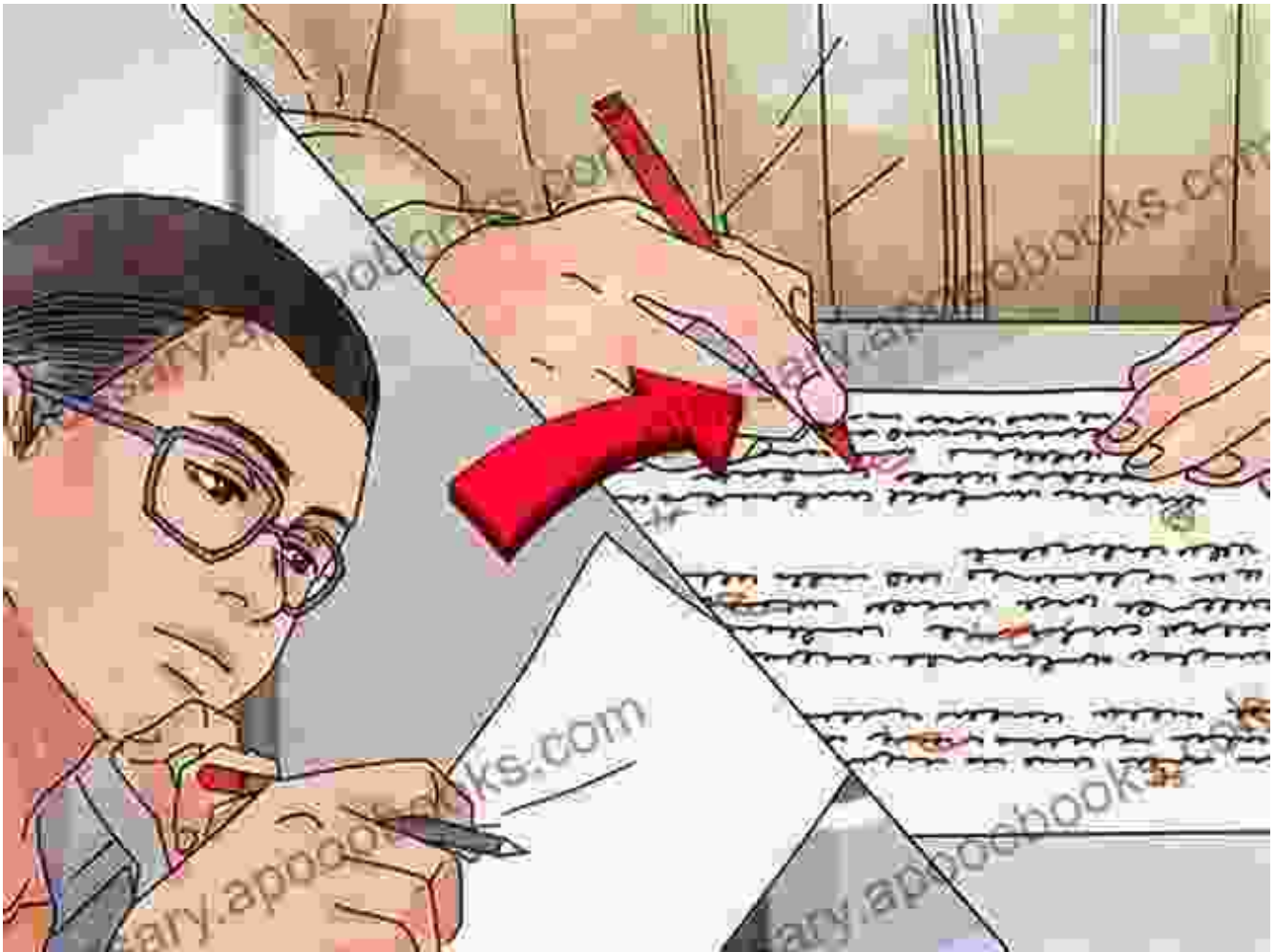

- **Add** – sentences and words
- **Remove** – words or sentences you don't need
- **Move** – change a word or placement of a sentence
- **Substitute** – trade words or sentences for new ones

When editing a manuscript, only the structure of writing is corrected. These are minor changes that include:

- **Capitalize** – names, places, titles, months, etc.
- **Usage** – nouns and verbs are correctly used
- **Punctuation** – periods, quotes, commas, semicolons, apostrophes, etc.
- **Spelling** – check all words, look for homophones, use a dictionary
- **Grammar/ Sentence structure**

- **Self-Assessment:** Take a critical look at your writing and identify areas for improvement.
- **Peer Review:** Gather feedback from trusted peers or instructors to gain diverse perspectives.
- **Editing:** Polish your writing by correcting grammar, punctuation, and sentence structure.

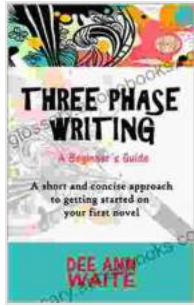

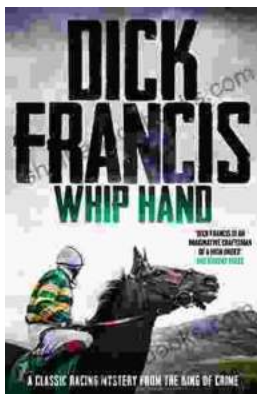
